## HISTORY

In 1950, the Inland Waterways Association gave its support to the restoration of the derelict Lower Avon Navigation, the very first restoration initiated by the IWA. This work, which was carried out by the newly formed charity, Lower Avon Navigation Trust (LANT), under the dynamic leadership of Douglas Barwell OBE took 12 years to complete. This was the first navigation to be restored and run by volunteers.

**The re-opening of the Lower Avon Navigation happened in 1962.**

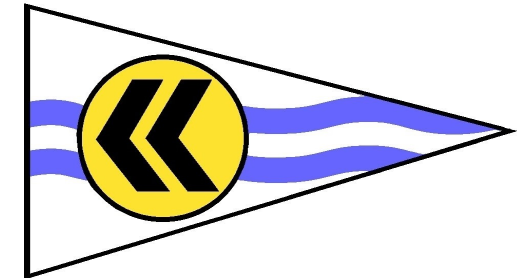
Again at the instigation of the IWA, an Upper Avon Committee was formed which resolved that the Upper Avon Navigation Trust Limited (UANT) should be founded to restore the Upper Avon Navigation. The position of Project Manager was offered to David Hutchings who had recently reopened the southern section of the Stratford Canal. The Upper Avon was restored between 1969 and 1974.

**On 1st June 1974 the navigation to Stratford-upon-Avon was ceremonially reopened by HM Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother, and in the following year HM The Queen travelled upon the waterway.**

The Lower and Upper Avon Navigation Trusts worked together over many years towards amalgamation.

**On the 1st January 2010, LANT and UANT legally amalgamated as Avon Navigation Trust. This is the first time that the River Avon has been run as one since 1717 over 300 years ago.**
